


Literacv

Our focus story this week was Owl Babies. In drawing club the children drew some fabulous pictures of the owls. Later in the week we thought about other animals that might be spotted by the owls in the woods at night. New vocabulary included; disappeared, remained, fearless, presumed, hushed, swooped, anxiety, and swooping. In phonics this week we have been recapping the sounds and consolidating blending and segmenting skills.

At home you could try:

- · Reading the words attached and spotting sounds when out and about.
- Finding two sets of items e.g. 5 lego blocks and 5 cars and checking to see they have the correct amount by matching.
- Practicing forming the letters shapes d, g, s, remembering the anticlockwise direction.
- Practising play lines and songs

Maths

This week, the children have continued to engage with activities that draw attention to the purpose of counting – to find out 'how many' objects there are. The children have been revisiting 1:1 correspondence by making sure that they match collections of objects to their representations. They have been developing their understanding of the concept of cardinality – that the last number in the count tells us 'how many' things there are altogether.

<u>Understanding</u> the World

This week in PSED we have been thinking about our homes and what is the same and what is different about them.

After reading the Owl Babies we were keen to find out about other animals that might be out and about at night. We found out that these animals are called nocturnal animals. We learnt that some nocturnal animals have big eyes to help them see in the dark, while others have really good hearing.



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Start in the clouds- over the top and round, all the way up to the sky, back down to the runway, flick


